



THINGS TO SEE IN NORWAY

If you are in Norway there are many things to see. I have picked just a few of them to share with you. The first is Akhershus Fortress. It is located in Oslo, the capital of Norway. It was built to protect Oslo from any invaders. It's now a historic landmark. In around 1588 it was made into a castle by King Christian IV. If you visit today, you will see all kinds of things from medieval living quarters to dark dungeons.

Another thing that you must see if you are in Norway are the northern lights. They are a beautiful spectacle that light up the sky with colors. The lights are also known as Aurora Borealis and can be best seen in northern parts of Norway.

You should also check out Mount Floyen. You can either hike or take the funicular up to an observation area near the top of the mountain. From up there you have a great view of Bergen, one of the biggest cities in Norway. If you get hungry you could order lunch at the Floyen Folk Restaurant.

FISKESUPPE

Ingredients 4 cups fish stock 2 tbsp flour 1/2 cup double cream 2 carrots, diced 3 potatoes, diced 1 leek, roughly chopped

1 tsp white wine vinegar Pinch of sugar 400g fish (any kind you like), cut into chunks Salt Black pepper



Method:

- 1. Bring the stock to a simmer in a medium pot.
- 2. Add the chopped vegetables and leek, then simmer for 3-4 minutes, so the vegetables start to soften.
- 3. Whisk the flour into the cream, then whisk it into the stock to make a smooth soup.
- 4. Add the vinegar, sugar, salt and pepper to taste.
- 5. Bring the soup to a boil, add the fish chunks, and cook for 5 minutes, or until the fish pieces are cooked.
- 6. Serve immediately with bread and butter

RØMMEGRØT (DESSERT)


Ingredients 4 cups milk 3/4 cup flour 1/4 cup sugar Pinch of salt 1/2 cup butter, plus more for serving Cinnamon sugar for serving

Instructions


- 1. Mix the flour, sugar, and salt in a small bowl.
- 2. Melt the butter.
- 3. In a large saucepan, bring the milk to a simmer, stirring constantly so it doesn't burn.
- 4. Stir the flour mixture into the melted butter to make a thick paste. Whisk this into the milk, then bring it to a boil.
- 5. Once the mixture boils, Turn the heat down to low and cook for 5 more minutes.
- 6. Serve in bowls with warm butter and cinnamon sugar.

Cut around each set of two flags - fold over toothpicks to make flags




MAP OF THE KINGDOM OF NORWAY





MARK THE POSITIONS ON THE MAP
